Electronic Collections:

- **Academic Search Complete (EBSCO):** Academic Search Complete offers access to more than 7,100 full-text periodicals, including more than 6,100 peer-reviewed journals. The database features PDF content going back as far as 1887, with the majority of full text titles in native (searchable) PDF format.
- **CINAHL (EBSCO):** CINAHL Plus with Full Text is a comprehensive source of full text for nursing & allied health journals, providing full text for more than 750 journals.
- **Business Source Complete (EBSCO):** Business Source Complete is a business database, providing the leading collection of bibliographic and full text content.
- **MasterFILE (EBSCO):** This multidisciplinary database provides full text for nearly 1,700 general reference publications with full text information dating as far back as 1975. Covering virtually every subject area of general interest, *MasterFILE Premier* also contains full text for nearly 500 reference books and over 164,400 primary source documents, as well as an Image Collection of over 502,000 photos, maps & flags.
- **Electronic Journal Center (EJC):** Full text of 7000+ research journals.

The Forums lead to new partnerships, policies, and cooperative planning efforts.

- **Disaster Mortuary Operational Response Team** (<http://www.dmort.org>): This is a Federal Level Response team designed to provide mortuary assistance in the case of a mass fatality incident or cemetery related incident. We work under the local jurisdictional authorities such as Coroner/Medical Examiners, Law Enforcement and Emergency Managers.
- **US National Response Team** (<http://www.nrt.org>): The U.S. National Response Team provides technical assistance, resources and coordination on preparedness, planning, response and recovery activities for emergencies involving hazardous substances, pollutants and contaminants, hazmat, oil, and weapons of mass destruction in natural and technological disasters and other environmental incidents of national significance.
