Guiding Ohio Online

- Application forms to place AmeriCorps members in public libraries have been distributed. Applications are due to the State Library by March 31, 2015. Applying libraries may request a full-time AmeriCorps member or a part-time AmeriCorps member for an 11-month term beginning in Fall 2015. A cash match is required from participating libraries.
- Guiding Ohio Online engages AmeriCorps members to perform training sessions, hands-on help, and other services to fulfill the vision of every Ohioan being able to fully participate in e-government, search for jobs online, understand the risks and benefits to internet finance, connect with family online, and protect personal information in the digital age. Guiding Ohio Online targets populations in rural Ohio, resulting in enhanced digital skills.

ILEAD USA

- ILEAD USA is an immersive continuing education program that develops library leaders through projects based on community needs using technology. The State Library is a partner in a Laura Bush 21st Century Librarian Program grant awarded to the State Library of Illinois by the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS).
- Three teams of four to five individuals per team have been selected to participate in ILEAD USA. The 2015 teams are "Team Hub," "Librarians for Equal Opportunity Marketing," and "Preserve Digital Ohio." The first session will be held March 24-26, 2015 at Mohican State Park. The second and third sessions will take place at Mohican State Park in June and October 2015.
