By clicking the upper right corner of the page or by clicking the bookmark icon in the tool bar, your place is saved. Share your research with your friends and colleagues by sharing the URL to the book you are reading.

### Ask a Librarian


An attorney was working on an appeal for a legal case and was given only a citation that noted the law referenced was repealed. He wanted to know what the law pertained to and the history.

**Answer:** The law was traced through a legislative history search process where the "Laws of Ohio" volumes in the Ohio Documents Collection we located and the law was traced back to the 1880's by referencing the Ohio General Code.

There has been a lot of talk about the filibuster in the news lately. But just what is a filibuster and how can it change how a bill makes it or does not make it to a vote?

**Answer:** A filibuster is a phenomenon in which a senator takes advantage of the Senate's rules allowing for unlimited debate, and refuses to yield the floor while speaking for an extended period of time. ## Use Sanborn maps to see construction and building details in Ohio since 1882




Section of 1891, Sheet #9 Columbus map


Over 40,000 detailed maps of Ohio cities drawn between 1882 and 1962.

The new home for our Sanborn maps not only makes it easy to find a map, but you can zoom in on details, print portions of maps, or download entire maps for non-commercial use.

Any resident of Ohio can access the maps at [ohioweblibrary.org/sanborn](http://ohioweblibrary.org/sanborn), though a public library card may be required if the system cannot determine your location. K-12 students, parents and teachers who have an INFOhio password can also access the maps through the list of resources for grades 9-12 at [www.infohio.org/er9-12matrix.html](http://www.infohio.org/er9-12matrix.html).
